For *February*: bring a travel-size bottle of shampoo.

If you need to catch up for the December or January meetings, bring 10 Band-Aids[®] or similar adhesive bandages (3/4" width) and a wide-tooth comb (preferably in original wrapper).

We're gathering materials to make disaster-relief packages—"Care Kits"—to donate to Heart to Heart International (which is headquartered right here in Johnson County.) It isn't too late to make up for the earlier meetings. The year-long project includes the following items:

July: two one-gallon Zip-Loc bags. August: a new wash cloth. September: a new hand towel. October: a travel-size bar of soap. November: one plastic travel size soap dish. December: ten Band-Aids (3/4" width). January: one wide-tooth comb. February: one small bottle of shampoo. March: one new, individually wrapped toothbrush. April: one travel-size tube of toothpaste May: one crisp new one-dollar bill (to offset shipping costs).

A "work party" will be scheduled for June, at which time the bags will be assembled for sending to the Heart to Heart warehouse in Kansas City, Kansas.

If every Overland Park Host Lion provides material for one "Care Kit," we'd be able to send over 40 to Heart to Heart. When the next disaster strikes – anywhere – we would have helped more than forty individuals get emergency relief items immediately! Everyone, please do your part!

Raffle Ticket Sales Help Anniversary Fund; Slight Change in Prices Brings Increase

Raffle ticket sales during visitations to other Lions clubs, at the Kansas Lions Mid-Winter Rally, and at the recent District K7 Cabinet meeting have increased the 50th-Anniversary Celebration fund by a significant amount.

Tickets sell for \$2 each or six for \$10. Thanks to a suggestion by Past International Director Ernie Young at the Mid-Winter Rally, a slight change in pricing resulted in an increase of sales there.

So . . . Host Lions Club members: if you still have tickets to sell, try the three-for-five-dollars approach along with the \$2 each and six-for –ten-dollars as originally publicized.

As a reminder, here are the prizes to be awarded at the Anniversary Banquet:

Grand Prize: Free night's lodging, 4 Water-Park passes, and a \$317 gift card to the Great Wolf Lodge, Kansas City, Kansas.

First Prize: Stainless steel, propane-fired outdoor bar-b-que grill (\$315 value), courtesy of Wal-Mart, 119th and Metcalf.

Second Prize: 20" Motorola color TV set with remote control.

Third Prize: A "priceless" lap quilt with Lion and sunflower theme, hand-sewn by Lion Mae Claxton.

Fourth Prize: Two pillows in Lion-theme material, hand-made by Lion Mae.

Fifth and sixth prizes: two nature-scene photographs, mounted on foam core board, ready for framing (donated by Bruce Nichols).

The Board of Directors of our club has decided not to participate at this time in a fund-raising opportunity proposed by the Deanna Rose Children's Farmstead. Board members were concerned about the number of days involved, the number of manhours required, and possible conflicts with other club activities already scheduled through the next several months.

Details of the proposal were included in the January Roar and discussed thoroughly at both the January and February board meetings.

The proposal can be discussed at a later date if some of the Board's concerns can be resolved; one way to do this is to recruit new members who could fulfill some of the tasks involved.

This year's Kansas Lions Mid-Winter Rally was a challenge for our district's Lions because of the weather! Still, we had a good turn-out and I found the seminars very informative and entertaining.

Lion John Daum, Past International Director from Spearfish, South Dakota, was the guest speaker. He was outstanding in his "Leadership" seminar.

We learned that the Wellington Lions Club raised \$35,000 in just 30 hours over one week-end. Their activities had something including a lot of fun—for everyone. There were 75-year-old ladies jumping out of airplanes, other participants riding the wind currents with parachutes and hot-air balloons, free carnival rides for young and old alike, magic shows, all kinds of games, parades, and even a group of Red Baron bi-planes filling the sky with aerial acrobatics and music from a variety of bands.

Lion Bryce Day, President of the Wellington Club (and selfappoint cheerleader of the Mid-Winter Rally!), told how that club at one point had only 16 members with an average age in the 70s. Today they have over 60 members and the average age is about 45.

The Flag program is a civic and patriotic gesture, but more than that it is the major fund-raising effort of our service year. Nearly \$12,000 annually has been donated by sponsoring merchants in each of the last three or four years.

Lion Jack Brown heads up the financial end of the program; Lions Dick Ferguson, Pat Gray and Art Meganck "honcho" the operations aspect of it.
