August Meetings Feature Outstanding Programs; September 13 Promises Another Good One!

Doug Brown, Director of Public Works for the City of Overland Park, was guest speaker on August 9. He described long-range and short-term plans for major changes in Overland Park. In the long-range planning area, he discussed an overview of Vision Metcalf. The short-term plans included infrastructure improvements, such as roads and sidewalks. His program included a PowerPoint presentation.

Cliff Franklin of Lawrence spoke on August 23. Recently returned from the Republic of Georgia, he described his narrow escape from Georgia during the hostilities between Georgian and Russian troops.

Cliff had been in the Republic of Georgia as a volunteer serving at a camp for diabetic children near Tbilisi. The camp is sponsored in part by the only Lions Clubs in Georgia and Lions Clubs in the United States, particularly the 20-20 Lions of Columbia, Missouri.

On **September 13**, our speaker will be **Frank Curtis**, a professor of voice at the University of Missouri-Kansas City. His topic will be special music programs he has instituted at the University. Dr. Curtis and his wife own an assisted-living facility in Shawnee. **Lion Ken Collyard** has arranged the program.

At the same meeting, we will present \$3,000 to the Kansas State School for the Blind (\$1,000 for the Assistive Technology Library and \$2,000 for the Industrial Arts program for new and safer power tools).

KSSB Superintendent **Lion Madeleine Burkindine** will be present to accept the contribution.

Next up is a garage sale on Friday and Saturday (the


