LION JANETTE REH VISITS LEADER DOGS SCHOOL AT ROCHESTER, MICHIGAN

in September 13 I, along with other Lions from Kansas and across the country, was the guest of Leader Dogs for the Blind in Rochester, Michigan. I represented both our club and the Lions of 17-O as the Service Dog Chairperson for the district.

During our tour of the facilities we were able to get a glimpse of all aspects of the program, including the housing and training facilities for both the service dogs and the individuals who come to Rochester to be recipients of the dogs. The process of selecting dogs and placing them with individuals was explained to us, and we had the opportunity to visit with people who had received service dogs and hear about the terrific difference the dogs had made in their lives.

Leader Dogs for the Blind is in its 70th year of providing service dogs for both blind and deaf-blind persons. The Leader Dog Program is a free program for qualifying individuals, but the cost for providing services is not cheap. The value of a trained service dog can be as high as \$35,000.

Modern technology devices such as Global Positioning Systems (GPS) with adaptations that assist with orientation and mobility cost between \$1,000 and \$2,000, depending on the specific device. These GPS systems have enabled blind individuals to be far more independent and mobile than when the blind had to rely solely on white canes.

This year the Overland Park Host Lions Club has included Leader Dogs for the Blind in the service budget. Treasurer Roger Claxton recently sent a \$500 check to Leader Dogs. In recognition of this donation, an inscribed brick will added to the Lions Clubs Brick Plaza at the Leader Dogs campus in Rochester.
