Board of Directors Notes

Meeting of January 3 (unofficial notes): (1) Treasurer's reports for December accepted. Informal review of notes from December 6 meeting [official minutes not yet available]. (2) Discussion of continuing help for special-needs family (victim of burglary); consensus was that our club is not in position to provide more than has been done (assistance with rent and a food basket); Janet Reh will work with head-of-household in getting aid from organizations more appropriate for him. (3) Edson Parker suggests visitation to Ottawa, Lenexa, and Prairie Village Lions Club. (4) Candy Day schedule discussed; April 3, 4 and May 8, 9 are tentative dates. (5) Board voted to ask club members to donate to a special fund to honor former Lion Nelson Lear. Contributions can be made to either the Kansas City All-Stars or to the OPH Lions Club Endowment Fund and designated for the Lear memorial. Opportunity will be given at the meeting of January 10 for this. (6) Approved motion to work with the Kansas State School for the Blind and other Kansas state agencies to try to have the track at the KSSB renamed "Lions Field, Nelson Lear Memorial Track". (7) Discussion of possible new meeting site. Consensus is that Bacchanalia is a good location. (8) Discussion as to whether this club needs three Vice Presidents and six Directors given current level of membership. No formal action taken; consensus was to hold elections for 2009-10 with current level of officers.

The Membership Committee at a recent planning meeting designed a member recruitment initiative that will culminate in a specially designed Membership Meeting on February 24. That meeting will feature a short presentation about Lions Clubs, brief descriptions of some of our club's major activities, and table displays that will tell

more about the things we do as Overland Park Host Lions.

So, where do you come in? There are several places.

- At our next three meetings (January 10, January 24, and February 14) you'll be given prospect cards to complete and give to the Membership Committee. The Lions on that committee will do the follow-up for inviting the prospects you recommend as potential Lions.
- Invite a friend to attend our January 24 and/or February 14 meetings. The speakers will be of high interest to different audiences. On January 24 *Eleanor Craig* of Accessible Arts at the Kansas State School for the Blind will describe exciting outdoor activities for blind youngsters. On February 14 County Commissioner Ed Eilert will address some of the issues relevant to Johnson County.
- Finally, at the February 24 meeting bring a guest who is a prospective member for our club. The most creative membership presentation in the world won't bring in new members if there are no prospects to see that presentation. So, be thinking now about the person you might invite on February 24. And, don't just invite the person—offer to actually bring him, her, or possibly a couple.

Our club can do so much more to support the good things we do in our community if we add to our membership base. As the members of our club age (a very natural process!) it is increasingly difficult to carry out major projects such as raising flags on Metcalf Avenue, ringing bells for the Salvation Army, and having Candy Days to raise money for the KU Ophthalmology Center. In addition, we've lost five members from the club for various reasons since the beginning of this Lions' year (July 1). Help the Membership Committee respond to the challenge of bringing in some new, younger members.
