Students at the Kansas State School for the Blind entertained Lions from the Kansas City Kansas Club Branch and Overland Park Host Club on Tuesday, April 14 in the cafeteria of the school.

The program included selections from the "Wizard of Oz" musical that the young people had performed in its entirety a few days earlier.

Members from our club who visited were Lions Edson Parker, Mae

Claxton, Ken and Carole Collyard, Frank Piepenbring, Paul Roemerman, and Neal and Beverly Nichols.

The students' performance was an effort to raise funds to cover the expenses of the Spring Prom and dinner. The Turner Lions Club donated \$100, OP Host donated \$50, and individual Lions added enough in a "pass-the-hat" collection to bring the total to over \$500.

Club Branch members and staff personnel of KSSB expressed their deep appreciation for the efforts our club has made to help them out.
