Kansas State School for the Blind Acquires Trekker Breeze "Talking GPS" Units With OPHLC Contributions



Three Overland Park Host Lions sat in on a Trekker Breeze training session for staff members at the Kansas State School for the Blind on August 24. Trekker devices are GPS units that visually impaired persons can use to know exactly where they are when walking on city streets, for example. Our club donated \$1000 to the Accessible Arts Discovery Trail program. Those funds were matched by Camps for Kids, resulting in enough money to purchase two Trekker units. This year's sale features LPs from the musicians who rocked Woodstock in 1969 and a collection of recordings from artists who died before their time, including Michael Jackson, George Harrison, Jim Croce, Jerry Garcia and Elvis Presley. As in the past, unusual, collectible and high-end audio equipment will be for sale.

Summary of Board of Directors Meeting, September 5, 2009

Meeting held at Winstead's in downtown Overland Park after Flag raising instead of Mimi's at Oak Park Mall.

Approved minutes of August 1 meeting; accepted Treasurer's report for August. Account Balances: Service, \$9659; General, \$1728.

Candy Day, August 15: Lion Heather Ralph reported that 14 members two-hour shifts Collection total \$638, an average of about \$22 per hour per Lion.

Candy Day, October 24: The Board voted to schedule a Candy Day only on Saturday, October 24 rather than on both Friday and Saturday, October 23-24.

The third annual Pasta Dinner and Silent Auction will be held on April 17 at the Overland Park Christian Church, 75th and Lowell.

Adopted Service (Charity) Budget with estimates of \$23,200 revenue and \$22,200 expenditures. Revenue includes approximately \$6000 carry-over from 2008-09. Estimated ending balance for 2009-10: \$1,000.

Adopted Operating Budget with estimates of \$14,125 revenue and \$14,312 expenditures. Revenue includes approximately \$4000 carry-over from 2008-09. Estimated ending balance for 2009-10: \$190 deficit.

Appointed committee to investigate sites for possible relocation of club meetings in 2010.

Approved funding for service project that will assist Shawnee Mission school nurses in obtaining digital thermometers for needy families.

Tabled discussion of the extent of participation in Hillcrest Transitional Housing program in Wyandotte and Johnson Counties.


