The Board of Directors approved the change in location at its meeting on December 5. A committee chaired by Lion Grant Rogers and comprised of Lions Roger Claxton, Carole Collyard, and Neal and Beverly Nichols recommended the change in location after a months-long review of several other potential sites in Overland Park, Leawood, and Lenexa.

Red Robin has a separate meeting room that will seat up to 55 persons comfortably. The restaurant is not open to the public in the early mornings, so there will be plenty of space in the general dining area if we should need extra space to accommodate any extra-large crowd, such as the annual Breakfast with Santa meeting.

Earl and Mary McIntosh Get the "Spotlight" in September Issue of Retirement Home Newsletter

The following article is a slightly edited version of an article in the Madison Word, a monthly newsletter published by Madison Estates (Independent Retirement Living), San Antonio, Texas. Earl McIntosh still keeps up his membership in our club, but has lived in San Antonio for the past three years.

Lovingly known as Mac, Earl can be seen swimming laps in the Madison's swimming pool almost year round. Mac understands the importance and value of exercise, particularly after the head injury which took him and Mary to San Antonio about 3-1/2 years ago so they could be near their son and live at Madison Estates.



Soon after Mac finished rehabilitation from the injury, he got involved in Madison Estates' mentor program. He has been a faithful mentor every Wednesday for three years and has worked with the same child each year. His mentee has now graduated from McDermott Elementary School and Mac was planning to start over this fall with another child.

Prior to coming to San Antonio, both Mac and Mary spent a lot of time volunteering. Mac volunteered with Boy Scouts (where he was a commissioner for Kansas) and with the Kansas State "Volunteers in Prison" program, and with the Overland Park Host Lions Club. He also served as a deacon in every church where they lived. Mary volunteered in hospitals wherever they lived, was a Cub Scout and Girl Scout leader and volunteered in their churches. You can see that they both feel that volunteering in the community is valuable.

Mary and Mac have been married for 60 years. They met when Mary was still in high school and they are still best friends today. Mac attended college at Washington University in St. Louis. He was an operations manager for AT&T for 37 years and lived in St. Louis, Kansas City, and Ennis, TX. Mac also served for 18 years in the Army National Guard with the 204th Signal Corps Battalion. He was called up for active duty twice.

Mary and Mac have two children. Their daughter is a Presbyterian minister on an Indian Reservation in Arizona and their son is an environmental consultant in San Antonio. Thanks, Mac and Mary, for sharing your time with the community.

OP Host Lions' Candy Day Success Results In District-Wide Challenge by Past Int'l Director

At the District Cabinet meeting in Prairie Village on November 14, **Past International President Ernie Young** (*Lansing Lions Club*) praised OP Host Lions for the almost-\$828 they collected in a one-day Candy Day effort on October 24.

But his accolades come with a price!

PID Ernie has challenged all District 17-O clubs to a contest, beginning on December 1 and running through the Spring, to see which clubs will hold the most Candy Days in that period and which ones can collect the most money.

Oh well. At least we know that fellow Lions outside our club do read the *Lions Roar*!

Details of the contest were a little sketchy, but PID Ernie promised a system of calculating results so that both large clubs and small ones would have equal chances to win.

Generally, Candy Day proceeds are earmarked for the Ophthalmology Clinic at the KU Medical Center, although that is not a hard and fast rule.

The OP Host Board of Directors voted not expand the Club's Candy Day efforts this year for several reasons. A calendar of activities was set early in the year, including two Candy Days in the Fall and one in the Spring. Advance notice to allow better planning would have been appreciated. In recent years, getting enough members able to work has been difficult. Our club consistently supports the Kansas Lions Sight Foundation with \$1000 or more each year.
