President's Message for September

September has started off with a real Lions' roar! "Old Glory" graced Metcalf Avenue from last Saturday morning through Tuesday morning (September 4-7). The breezy weekend days added emphasis to our efforts as about 475 Star-Spangled Banners waved proudly in the wind.

Now we must turn our attention to the annual Downtown Overland Park Arts & Crafts Festival. Our hot dog and brats concession stand is one of the largest fund-raising activities of the year and I encourage all of you to come out for at least part of the day to help. (With a bit of

embarrassment I admit that Lion Beverly and I won't be there. We'll be in Milwaukee participating in the USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forum.)

An exciting feature of this year's Festival will be the Kansas Lions Sight Foundation's Mobile Screening Unit (MSU, or "Sight Bus"). We owe our thanks to Lion Roger Claxton who not only arranged for the MSU to be here, but also worked with city officials so that the unit will be parked on Overland Park Drive very close to our concession stand.

The Board of Directors will meet on Saturday, September 18 at Mimi's Café at Oak Park Mall. The Board will discuss the critical issue of our Club's General Account. For each of the past several years, we have spent more than we have brought in. If income and expenses continue at the same level as in the past, this account will be "in the red" by June. Some combination of additional fund-raising, dues increase, and elimination of discounts for meals and dues will be necessary to balance this budget. Any dues increase will require amendments to our Constitution and By-Laws. I am hopeful that such amendments can be presented to the members by early October, with a vote at one of the November meetings.

Lion Beverly Nichols has been working hard arranging for an Alaskan cruise (with optional land tour added) to follow the Lions Clubs International Convention in Seattle next summer. The Convention will be held July 4 through 8, 2011 and the cruise will begin on July 9. Bus transportation will be available from Seattle to Vancouver, British Columbia where Lions and friends will board the Princess Cruise Lines ship *Diamond Princess*.

Lion Beverly has complete details regarding itinerary and prices. If you're interested in cruising, you should contact her soon in order to reserve cabin space and to get deposits made). Fares vary depending on type of cabin desired.

Because the cruise departs from Vancouver in Canada, *passports are required*. If you don't have one, or if yours will expire soon, take steps to correct that situation NOW! Applications are available at many U. S. Post Offices. Renewals cost about \$110 and new passports are about \$160.

All Kansas Lions—not just Overland Park Host members—have been informed of this opportunity. Don't be left out! Make your reservations now!
