NOVEMBER SERVICE PROJECT: SHOEBOXES FOR SOLDIERS

Our club's fourth annual "Shoeboxes for Soldiers" work day will take place at the next regular meeting, Saturday, November 13. Rather than listening to a speaker, we will have a change of pace as we put together care packages for soldiers in Afghanistan.



At the Overland Park Chamber of Commerce networking event on October 21, our Shoeboxes project was nicely promoted by one of the Chamber Ambassadors who urged those present to support our efforts. Supplies have been accumulating for the past several days and sufficient quantities should be on hand to fill boxes for all the names we have. Thanks go to **Lions Mae Claxton and Beverly Nichols** for organizing this project.

October Fund-Raising Activities

Last month was a very busy 31 days for Host Lions! A **garage sale** at the Claxton's home on October 15 and 16 resulted in a profit of slightly over \$680 for the General Account.

At **Candy Day**, held at Hy-Vee on October 23, we received approximately \$600 for the Service Account. Candy Day receipts help us meet our commitment to the KU Medical Center Ophthalmology Clinic (through the Kansas Lions Sight Foundation).

And on Sunday afternoon, Halloween Day, the City of Overland Park sponsored the third annual **"Trick or Treat Trail"** at the Matt Ross Community Center. We gave out about 700 bags of popcorn to costumed characters large and small—of all sorts (and their parents, too). About \$130 in donations were received, and this money will go into the Service Account. The Board of Directors approved participating and voted that all donations, after expenses, would go to the Service Fund.

Proof that Overland Park Host Lions are making an impact on the community comes in the fact that the city invited us to participate in the event. Kristina Stanley, Recreation Supervisor in the city's Recreation Services Department, made contact with Roger Claxton several weeks ago about providing popcorn during the afternoon.

As usual, we'll probably gather at Winstead's for breakfast after flags go up on Thursday. Friday breakfast is a little "iffy."



Zone Meeting on November 23 at Leawood City Hall



The **State Convention** and fourth State Council meeting will also be held at the Holiday Inn in Lawrence on June 2-4, 2011. Lions International President Sid Scruggs and his wife Judy will be featured guests. Let's have a great turnout that weekend.

Years ago our club had a huge presence at Mid-Winter Rallies and Conventions. We were one of the premier clubs in all of Kansas and I hope we can regain that status.

As if this schedule isn't enough to leave you breathless, there's the **International Convention** in Seattle from July 4-8. After the convention there will be a Kansas Lions Alaskan cruise (and optional land tour) beginning July 9. Sailing will be from Vancouver, British Columbia Canada. October Speaker

On October 23, our speaker was **Bob Moore**, Historian/Archivist for the Kansas City Chiefs Football Club. Moore highlighted the history of the American Football League, founded by Lamar Hunt, including the rivalry between the National and the American Football Leagues. He also explained how the Chiefs came to Kansas City from Dallas.

One particularly interesting point was that the Chiefs are actually named after the late H. Roe Bartle, who served many years as mayor of Kansas City, Missouri. Bartle was active in the Tribe of Mic-o-Say, a Boy Scout honors camping program. His nickname was "Chief," and as Bartle was instrumental in bringing the football team to KC, Lamar Hunt chose to name our team in honor of him.
