The dates work well for Overland Park Host Lions to attend because they fall over a fifth weekend and won't interfere with a scheduled club meeting.

Pages 1 and 5 of the KLN have details, so only a couple are repeated here for emphasis.

First, note that Friday, January 14 is the deadline to reserve rooms at the Courtyard Inn (785-210-1500). Ask for room rates for "Kansas Lions Mid-Winter Rally" when you call.

Second, two International guests will attend the Rally. International Director J. Carl Young (and his wife Elizabeth) of Canada will be featured guests. He will speak at the Saturday night banquet.

PID Barry Palmer and his wife Anne from Australia will also attend. PID Palmer is an endorsed candidate for 2nd International Vice President in the election to be held at the LCI Convention in Seattle next July.

If he is elected **PID Palmer** will be LCI President when the **2013 USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forum** is held in Overland Park. OPHLC members can take advantage of the opportunity to meet him and get acquainted during the Mid-Winter Rally.
