

Mobile Screening Unit (MSU) Draws Another Good Crowd at Overland Park Fall Festival

The Kansas Lions Mobile Screening Unit was a popular attraction again this year at the Fall Festival. Between 50 and 60 persons stopped for various health screenings.

The MSU is equipped for two kinds of visual screening, hearing screening, blood-sugar testing, and blood-pressure testing.

The picture below was taken fairly early on Saturday morning before the unit was open to visitors. The MSU was completely designed, manufactured, and decorated in Kansas. It is in its third year of operation and the number of scheduled dates continues to grow each year. Most week-ends are booked far in advance and some Lions Clubs in smaller towns report that even on weekdays they see a steady stream of residents wanting to take advantage of the MSU services.

It's Time to Start Thinking Seriously About the 2013 USA/Canada Forum



The 37th annual USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forum will be held in Overland Park, September 19-21, 2013 (although members of various leadership committees will begin arriving on about Sunday, September 15).

The 2013 Forum will be on a third weekend and will not conflict with the Downtown Overland Park Festival.

The **Forum 13 Host Committee** is getting organized and in the next few weeks and will be sending out calls for help in a number of areas.

One way Overland Park Host Lions (and all Kansas Lions) can help is to register for the **2012 Forum** in Tampa Bay, Florida. During that Forum, Kansans will have a promotion booth and will be pre-registering attendees for 2013. This activity requires a lot of staffing—nine to twelve Lions in the booth at all times, Thursday through Saturday, from about 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. With enough Kansas Lions at Tampa Bay, shifts can be short and no one should have to work more than one or two during the three days there. (The Tampa Bay Forum is also on a third weekend and won't conflict with the Fall Festival!)

As soon as registration information for 2012 is received from the Forum Office (probably around the first of the year) we'll make it available so individual Lions can get registered.

At the 35th Forum in Anchorage, Alaska last month, Ye Olde Editor Neal Nichols was appointed by the Executive Committee to be 2013 Host Committee Chair. Past Council Chair Bill Phillipi (Marysville, KS Lions) and Lion Harry Malnicof (Leawood Lions Club) will assist him as Associate Chairs. Current District 17-O First Vice District Governor Beverly Nichols will serve as Host Committee Secretary and Lion Andy Hoedl (Lenexa Lions Club) will be Host Committee Treasurer. Lion Max Gordon (Overland Park Host Lions Club) will serve as Host Committee legal advisor. Other Host Committee positions will be filled over the next few months.

Forums are planned, organized and carried out by a Planning Committee under the direction of a general chairperson.

Past International Director Douglas Lozier of Indiana will be Planning Committee Chair for the Overland Park Forum.

Most Planning Committee sub-committees have a counterpart in the Host Committee structure and these serve under the direction of Planning Committee chairs. They carry out necessary tasks at the local level, in effect being the "go-fers" for the Planning Committee.

Fellow Lions, *hundreds* of volunteers are needed to make a Forum successful. If we all do our parts—large or small—we can put Overland Park in the Forum record books as having had the biggest and best Forum yet! Please say "YES" when you're asked to serve.
