### The Strang Line and Overland Park to be featured in this week's program



# Topeka is site for District Convention; Lion Beverly becomes Governor-Elect

The 2012 District 17-O convention will be held at the Holidome in Topeka next week-end, March 16-17. Convention chairman **Bobby Duvall** (Topeka Sunflower Lions), convention chairman, says, however, that we're not really having a convention but rather a *PARTY!* In keeping with St. Patrick's Day, the menu includes corned beef and cabbage for Saturday's lunch and Irish stew for the evening banquet.

Our own **Lion Beverly Nichols** will become District Governor-Elect after delegates vote Saturday afternoon. She currently serves as 1st Vice District Governor.

On Friday night, the District 17-O Past District Governors Club will sponsor a steak fry as a fund-raising project. Money earned will help provide scholarships for Lions to attend the Great Plains Lions Leadership Institute at Doane College in Crete, Nebraska next summer. # AHNA VALDEZ, STATE PEACE POSTER CONTEST WINNER, EARNS INTERNATIONAL MERIT AWARD FOR HER ENTRY!



For **Ahna Valdez** (*right*) the third time was the charm. Her Peace Poster Contest entry (*shown above*) this year not only received first-place honors at the District and State levels, but now has earned the coveted distinction as an **International Merit Award finalist**—*one of only 23 throughout the world*! Ahna submitted entries in 2010 and 2011, earning second and third place prizes at the District 17-O level.

Overland Park Host Lions Club was Ahna's sponsor all three years. To the best of our knowledge, Ahna is the second Kansan to win a Merit Award. Several years ago a student from Spring Hill won a Merit Award. Ahna will receive \$500 from LCIF in addition to other cash awards at local, District and State levels.

The annual Peace Poster contest is sponsored by the Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF). About 350,000 children, ages 11-13, participate in contests sponsored by local Lions Clubs. Winning entries from clubs progress to District Contests, then to the Multiple District (state) level. Approximately 125 multiple district winning posters are then sent to LCIF for final judging. One grand prize winner is selected and only 23 additional Merit Awards are presented.



#### Fourth-grade foresters project still on track

Trees for the Fourth-Grade Foresters planting project that was announced last month have been ordered and should arrive soon. **Lion Heather Lanigan** will deliver them to Rosehill Elementary School and fourth-grade students will take them home for planting. Our Board of Directors approved the expenditure for this project at a recent meeting.
