International President's asks Lions to "Focus on Literacy" in 2012-2013...

Literacy Coordinator for Urban Scholastic Center in KCK to speak at Saturday meeting

Alex Matthew, Literacy Coordinator for the Urban Scholastic Center (USC) in Kanas City, Kansas will present the program for our meeting on Saturday, June 9. **Lion Grant Rogers** first made our club aware of the USC after hearing the Center's executive director at a networking event tell about the need for books for innercity children. These children have few if any books of their own at home.



Overland Park Host Lions began collecting books from a variety of sources and delivered almost 500 books to the USC earlier this Spring.

Alex will describe the Center's program and its efforts to improve literacy in inner-city areras.

Saturday's program is especially relevant to Lions because incoming Lions International President Wayne Madden has made "Focus on Literacy" one of the major programs for the coming year.

Two Metcalf Flag Days in June, July

The 2012 Metcalf Avenue of Flags program continues with expanded showings on Flag Day (June 14-16) and a full week's display for Independence Day (June 30-July 7). Dropoff teams will go out at 5 AM on June 14 and 30. Other teams will follow at 6 o'clock to put the Flags up.

The Flags will come down at 6 a.m. on June 16 and July 7 (both dates are on Saturdays), respectively.

One of the lengthiest displays in the 49-year history of this program was just concluded on June 2. Flags went up on May 19 in honor of Armed Forces Day and stayed up through the entire week after Memorial Day.

Sign-up sheets have been circulated at the last couple of club meetings. If you haven't already signed up, you can still do so at this week's meeting.

After Flags were posted on May 19, about 15 Overland Park Host Lions and friends went to Antioch Park, supporting the Merriam-Shawnee Lions Club in their annual pancake day. The pancake feed was held in conjunction with Merriam's Turkey Creek celebration and is the major fund-raiser each year for the Merriam-Shawnee Lions.

Beverly Nichols to be 2012-13 District Governor

Another Overland Park Host Lion is set to take district reins at the close of the International Convention in Busan, South Korea on June 27. Lion Beverly Nichols was elected 2nd Vice District Governor in 2010, moved to 1st VDG in 2011 and this year will be Governor.

She is the fourth OPHLC members to be a District Governor. Lions **Frank Piepenbring** (1971-72) and **Jim Goudelock** (1991-92) served as District Governors in the old District 17-AE and **Neal Nichols** (2007-08) served in the old District 17-K7.

Over the years, declining membership has required redistricting in Kansas from eight to seven to five districts.

A **Melvin Jones Fellowship** is presented upon payment of \$1,000 by a Lions Club (or individual) to the Lions Clubs International Foundation *(LCIF)*.

A Claude Devorss Fellowship may be presented upon payment of \$1,000 by a Lions Club (or individual) to the Kansas Lions Sight Foundation (KLSF).

Our club's practice has been to donate \$1,000 to LCIF and present a Melvin Jones Fellowship each year. We donate \$500 per year to KLSF and present a Claude Devorss Fellowship every other year.

Melvin Jones Fellowships honor the memory of Melvin Jones, who founded Lions Clubs International in 1917.

Claude Devorss Fellowships honor the memory of Claude Devorss, a much-loved Kansas Lion who served as International President in 1965-66.

The 2013 USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forum will be held in Overland Park September 19-21. The Forum's Planning Committee will meet here October 24-28 of this year.
