Club Directors Begin Merger Talks With Prairie Village Lions Club

The OPHLC Board of Directors met with representatives of the Prairie Village Lions Club on Saturday, September 1 and discussed the possibility of the two clubs merging in the near future. The request for merger discussions came from the Prairie Village club.

Prairie Village members in attendance were **President John Trinkl**, **Past International Director Bob Tonjes**, and **Past President Kim Morrow**.

Several issues were resolved at the meeting. The merged club would keep the OPHLC name and meetings would continue to be held on second and fourth Saturdays. OPHLC officers and directors would continue in their positions until the end of this Lions service year. Election of 2013-14 officers will be held next April and all members of the merged club will be eligible for election.

Not all Prairie Village Lions would become members of OPHLC. Some have expressed an interest in joining a club that does not meet on Saturday mornings. Others have indicated they may drop Lions membership altogether. **District Governor Beverly Nichols** has contacted these Lions by mail asking them to reconsider and retain their membership, whether in OPHLC or some other club.

Prairie Village Lions' property—including their trailer and American Flags—would transfer to OPHLC. Funds in their service account would be spent on projects of their choosing.

Lion Beverly is assisting in the merger process in her role as District Governor to ensure that all requirements of Lions Clubs International are met.

A proposed target date for a resolution to merge is December 1, 2012 with implementation to be completed by December 31.

Prairie Village Lions have already voted to approve a merger. Overland Park Host Lions will have to vote on it later.

One of the last steps in the merger process is approval by the District Cabinet.

Supplies needed for Heart to Heart disaster kits—Bring hand towels

Our club will once again be collecting supplies for emergency kits to be distributed by Heart to Heart in disaster-hit areas. Items needed are hand towels, wash cloths, wide-tooth combs, 15-ounce bottles of shampoo, toothbrushes, 4- to 6-ounce tubes of toothpaste, bars of soap, adhesive bandages (such as Band-Aids®), and zipper-seal plastic bags.

Overland Park Host Lions directors voted on September 1 to help in this project. Members are asked to bring new hand towels to next meeting. Bundles of 5 are about a dollar each at stores such as Dollar Tree.
