Our club's annual Pasta Supper and Silent Auction will be held on Saturday, May 18. Tickets for this fund-raising event are available from **Lion Mae Claxton**. A lot of items are needed for the auction part of the event. These can be new or gently-used things from around your house or they can be donations from businesses. Typical contributions include gift cards from restaurants, beauty salons/spas, auto-service establishments and the like. Some companies will donate products instead of services. If you patronize a local firm regularly, just ask if the manager will provide an item for you to put up for auction.

This year a live auction will be held in addition to the usual silent one. **Lion Phil Detrixhe**, a member of the Overland Park Hospitality Lions Club Branch and a professional auctioneer, will donate his service and be the caller.

A "Pound Auction" is another new feature under serious consideration for this year's program. This is an idea copied from the District 17-I convention held in Salina in February. Club members donate "white elephant" items, but put them in lunch-sack-sized brown paper bags and then staple the bags shut. Attendees bid "sight unseen" on the bags. Some gifts are fairly valuable while others might be humorous or simply bag fillers. A Pound Auction can be more than just a lot of fun for bidders and observers—it can also raise quite a bit of money.

No longer a "Club Branch"...

University of Kansas Eye Center Lions Chartered by Lions Club International!

District Governor Beverly Nichols announced last week that the University of Kansas Eye Center Lions Club Branch has enrolled enough members to be chartered as a full-fledged Lions Club and will no longer be a branch of our club. A Charter was granted by Lions Clubs International on April 4, 2013.



A Charter Night celebration will be held on Wednesday, June 12 from 5:30 to 7:30 PM at the Eye Center Offices, 7400 State Line Road in Prairie Village. More details on

this event will be announced as they are developed.

Existing clubs traditionally honor a new club with gifts such as a bell and gavel, banner, and American Flag. Some clubs give gifts of cash to help get the new administrative account started.

Overland Park Host Lions will present an American Flag and stand to the KU Eye Center Lions Club. This is a long-standing tradition and shows the connection between our Metcalf Avenue of Flags project and the ceremonial Flag the new club will use.

Our club is the official sponsor of the new club. A hefty result of sponsorship is that we have earned 3,000 points in the District Governor's Point Contest.

The "short name" of the new club will be "KU Eye Center Lions." Officially, however, the club will be chartered and known as the University of Kansas Eye Center Lions Club. There are two reasons for this: (1) Lions Clubs International does not accept initials (for example, KU) in a club's official name; and (2) KU as an institution requires that any organization using the name must use "University of Kansas," not "KU" or "Kansas University."

Past International Director Ernie Young of the Lansing Lions Club will be the Guiding Lion for the Eye Center club and will serve in that capacity for two years. The Guiding Lion program helps assure that a new club starts "on the right foot" and gets proper guidance from an experienced Lion in the early stages of development.

Dr. John Sutphin will serve as Charter President of the Eye Center Club. Dr. Dirk DeKeyser will be vicepresident. Emily Sutphin and Abby Strickland will serve as secretary and treasurer, respectively. Emily Coolbaugh will be Membership Chairperson.

Some Trivia About Trivia . . .
