Most of our members are aware that Candy Days—the annual effort to raise funds for the Kansas Lions Sight Foundation (KLSF)—have fallen into disfavor. There are several reasons for this. The public doesn't donate as much as in previous years. Retailers have become more restrictive in allowing groups to solicit at their locations. And fewer of our members are willing to stand with collection buckets and ask for money.

Yet the need remains. The KLSF needs money to continue serving the people of Kansas, especially those with sight impairment. And we should continue our strong support of KLSF.

A solution?



**Pecans!** Fresh from the Camilla Pecan Company in Camilla, Georgia, and just in time for holiday-season

cooking and baking.

This new project will be discussed in detail at the meeting this Saturday, October 12. Other kinds of nuts besides pecans are available, also. Price lists will be available at Saturday's meeting.

Pecan sales have been real money makers for several clubs in our district. Your Board of Directors voted last week to see if they would be successful for us as well.

The nuts we would offer for sale will be FRESH—delivered less than a month after they're picked. (Most retailers are selling from last year's crop.) The nuts will also be less expensive than those sold in stores (compared with recent prices seen on store shelves).

The nuts will be ordered through the Leavenworth Lions Club to take advantage of free shipping and a full 8% discount off regular purchase price.

Our responsibility—besides selling, of course—will be to go to Leavenworth to get the nuts and to pay for the order when we pick them up, or at least within three weeks after delivery Everything dampened but Lions' spirits . . . Rain, Cold Wind Put "Chill" On Profits at Fall Festival Food Booth

High praise for Forum committee's efforts . . .

### **USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forum Is "Monster success!"** "Phenomenal!"

"A monster success," said **Past International Director Doug Lozier**, Planning Committee chairperson, reflecting on the 2013 USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forum held in Overland Park, September 19-21.

"A phenomenal job," said **PID Gary Anderson**, a former Host Committee chairperson from Michigan, heaping praise on the work done by the Forum '13 Host Committee.

These are only two of the many very positive comments and compliments heard around the Overland Park Convention Center and nearby hotels during and after the Forum.

Every subcommittee of the Forum '13 Host Committee did an outstanding job of making the event run smoothly.

Over two hundred volunteers—many from out of state—helped as airport greeters, drivers for VIPs, hallway monitors, Forum Store workers, and seminar "runners." Other tasks included entering seminar-evaluation data into computerized records, stuffing hospitality bags and distributing registration materials—really, too many jobs to list them all.

Overland Park Host Lions Club members were among the volunteers. Lynn Wolfe drove VIPs from and to the KCl Airport. Teresa Wolfe, Heather Lanigan and Ken and Carole Collyard sold pins and tickets for the dolls drawing. Carole also coordinated the collection of school supplies and books. Janette Reh and Dottie Bloome helped in the KLSF Mobile Screening Unit. Steve Weinrich helped in data entry of seminar evaluation results. Neal and Beverly Nichols served on the Forum '13 Host Committee.

Some highlights of the Forum included "testimonials" from Kansans who benefited from Lions' assistance: a tornado victim whose home was restored by Kansas Lions with help from LCIF funds; a girl who told about attending a Lions-sponsored diabetes camp; a student at the Kansas State School for the Blind who told how Lions helped her and her family go to California, where she won the national Braille Challenge championship in her age level; and a high school girl, suffering severe sight impairment caused by brain cancer, who got a new outlook on life from doctors serving in KanLovKids, a low-vision program funded by an LCIF grant.
