Work project to be at VFW Hall on Grant (near Library) in Overland Park

This coming Saturday is our annual "Shoeboxes for Soldiers" work day.

The location will be at the VFW Hall, 8804 Grant in Overland Park. (Directions: Take 87th Street Parkway to Grant Street. Grant is 9500 West and a little over a block east of the Johnson County Central Resource Library building. Turn south, go about a block and a half and turn right. There is a sign marking the entrance to the VFW building.)

Set-up of tables and materials will take place at the VFW Hall on **Friday evening** beginning at 7:30 PM. Volunteers are needed to help with this. Please join in.

On **Thursday evening**, volunteers are needed to help sort materials and get them ready to take to VFW. This will be done at the **Claxton's** home, 10404 Nieman Road, beginning at 6:00 PM.

We will not have access to the VFW building before 7:30 AM on Saturday, so activities. will begin at 8:00 AM. A continental breakfast will be available on Saturday.

Among items that are still needed are travel size toothpaste, travel size hand sanitizers, travel size deodorant (liquid roll-on, not stick), puzzle books, magazines, DVDs, and cookies such as oatmeal-raisin. Small cans of fruit are also needed, but be sure to get the kind with pull-tab tops, no plastic covers.

The Shoeboxes for Soldiers program has become one of our club's signature projects over the last few years. Your help is needed to make it a success again this year.

Officer elections to be held on April 12; Nominating Committee already at work

Election of 2014-2015 club officers will take place at the regular meeting of April 12.

The Nominating Committee—comprised of Lions **Beverly Nichols**, **Lynn Wolfe** and **Ken Collyard**—is compiling a slate of names to present to the club next month.

The club constitution specifies that a nomination meeting be held in March each year. Notice of the meeting shall be published at least fourteen calendar days prior to the date of the meeting. The Board of Directors will probably set a date at its March 1 meeting, in time for it to be published in the March *Lions' Roar* and meet the deadline.

At the nomination meeting, nominations for all offices to be filled may also be made from the floor.

The constitution also specifies that an election meeting shall be held in April. Traditionally in this club the election occurs at the first regular meeting in April so that the secretary has time to file the necessary reports of officers to Lions Clubs International (LCI).

LCI requires that all elections be by written (secret) ballot.

Redistricting News ...

"Merging" of Districts 17-I and 17-O Requires Constitutional Convention

Leadership in Kansas Lions Multiple District 17 and the five existing sub-districts has been working hard all year to bring about a smooth transition to three sub-districts.

Our club is currently in District 17-O. We were not affected by the reduction of seven to five districts in 2008-09. This time around, however, because of severe losses in membership, the current Districts 17-I (to the west of us) and 17-O will be blended into one—a new District 17-A. (A few clubs in the present districts will go to the new Districts 17-K or 17-N but for all practical purposes, 17-I and 17-O will merge.

On April 12, a convention to approve a constitution for the new district and to elect a District Governor and two Vice District Governors will be held in Topeka. The convention will be at the Highland Park Methodist Church, 29th and Michigan in Topeka.

Our club (including the Overland Park Hospitality Club Branch) will be entitled to five delegates. The convention will not convene until 1 o'clock in the afternoon, so there will be no conflict with our regular meeting that day.

If you are interested in serving as a delegate and taking part in this historic event—launching a completely new district—contact **Big Lion Carole Collyard** to let her know. A date to formally elect delegates will be set very soon.
