Constitutional Convention Scheduled

Because of redistricting in Kansas Multiple District 17 (going from five sub-districts to three), a Constitutional Convention for the new District 17-A is required. It will be held at the Highland Park United Methodist Church, 2900 Michigan in Topeka on April 12.

Voting on a new constitution and by-laws and election of district leadership for 2014-15 will take place.

The new district will be a combination of the current District 17-O and District 17-I. Our club is entitled to five delegates. Four have already been appointed by the Board of Directors. If you want to be the additional delegate, please let **Big Lion Carole Collyard** know as soon as possible.

Our own **Beverly Nichols**, MD-17 Council Chairperson will convene the convention and preside over all business matters. She expects the meeting to last between one-and-one half and two hours.
