

Ratification meeting on March 14 New constitution for OPHLC ready for club-member vote

The Board of Directors approved a final draft of a new Constitution and By-Laws (C&BL) for our club at its February 7 meeting. The new document is based on



the Lions Clubs International *Standard Form Club Constitution and By-Laws*, with some changes made to reflect this club's situation and practices.

Copies of the new document will be distributed at Saturday's club meeting; members not present will receive copies through the US Postal Service.

A vote on ratifying the C&BL will be held at the regular meeting on March 14. A two-thirds affirmative vote by those present and voting is required for adoption.

The Board of Directors unanimously recommends that club members vote to adopt the new constitution. It will consolidate the existing patchwork of by-laws and strengthen the overall structure of the club.

If ratified, the new C&BL document will become effective on July 1, 2015.

Shoeboxes for Soldiers—March 28

This year's **Shoeboxes for Soldiers** work day will be on Saturday, March 28 and will replace the regular meeting. We will meet in the basement of Legacy Christian Church, 10150 Antioch Road in Overland Park, at 8 AM instead of at Perkins at 7:30. A continental breakfast will be available. Serving Each Other to Serve Others

In preparation for 2015-16, our incoming president—Lion Steve Weinrich—will be establishing the committees and naming their members and chairpersons. Our speaker on January 25 was **Debra Ryder**, director of education at the Kansas City Zoo. She told about a new orangutan exhibit that will be opening in late May. Part of her presentation focused on the possible extinction of orangutans in Sumatra and Borneo due to the destruction of their native forest habitats. Residents of the two islands are cutting away traditional forests and replacing them with trees that produce palm oil, a major money crop. Mrs. Ryder is a former teacher at Shawnee Mission Northwest High School, among other careers
