President's Message for June by Teresa Wolfe, President The Fruits of Our Labors

Following up on my comments in March's *ROAR* about our club's fund raising projects, it's timely to summarize what the proceeds from these projects (and their volunteer hours and contributions) do in serving various needs in our community.



Approximately \$7000, or about 50%, of the proceeds pay for—

-eyeglasses and eye exams for those in need;

—programs at the Kansas School for the Blind, including various learning programs, arts programs and physical education programs;

-support of the Lions Mobile Screening Unit;

-the KU Audio-Reader program;

- -training programs for service dogs for the blind;
- -and an annual contribution to the KU Eye Clinic.

Approximately \$5000, or about 40%, is directed to—

—activities and programs for children and youth in our community, including: scholarships for high school graduates seeking service-oriented careers;

—scholarships for youth to attend programs to development their leadership skills and equip them for community service;

-reading initiative programs for families and children;

—support for youth programs, such as Scouting, that promote character-building and service to others.

—scholarships for students to the Kansas Lions State Band (this year OPHLC sponsored six students at \$250 each!)

Approximately \$1000 was spent to prepare and send packages of personal-care items and snack items to our soldiers serving in the combat areas in the Middle East.

Another \$1000 was contributed to the Lions Club International Foundation to assist in meeting needs of people following disasters throughout the world, including the U.S. This contribution also provides the opportunity for our club to honor an outstanding member with a Melvin Jones Fellowship.

Our commitment to serve our community includes many hours of volunteer service to specific Lions Club service activities as well as programs such as Harvesters Food Bank, eye screening for pre-school and kindergarten children, Head Start reading programs, the Salvation Army bell-ringing program, and other community volunteer programs.

Sometimes, too, it's difficult to look beyond the labor and the fund-raising efforts of the "Metcalf Avenue of Flags" project, the Overland Park Fall Festival food booth, the Pasta Dinner and Silent Auction project, and the Pecan Sales project. We can measure the money our projects produce. But, the contribution our projects and individual Lions efforts make to building "community" in the Overland Park, and surrounding cities, is immeasurable.
